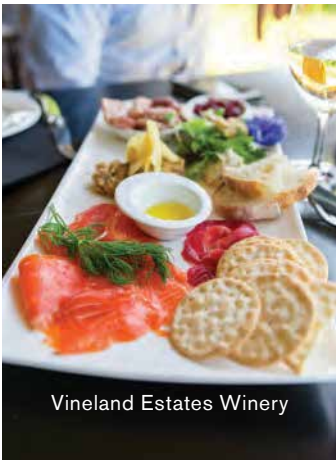

THE GOOD KIND OF DRAMA

A really great reason to come to Niagara-on-the-Lake is the renowned Shaw Festival, which runs from April to October. With 10 or more professionally produced plays by Bernard Shaw, Charles Dickens, Agatha Christie and others every year in three theatres, there's always something on stage to entertain you.

FLAVOUR TOWN FAVOURITES

Combine a visit to the theatre with a trip to Niagara-on-the-Lake's ambitious restaurants and pubs. A centre of fine dining, the town fosters a competitive spirit among its top chefs at restaurants such as HobNob, Tiara, Noble, The Garrison House, and The Cannery. Local seasonal ingredients are the star on their menus.

FORT GEORGE SLICE OF HISTORY

History classes can be boring for kids, but at Fort George, they'll be enthralled to time travel back to the War of 1812 and interact with costumed storytellers and musket demonstrators. Special events include reenactments of World War I and the Napoleonic Wars.

NIAGARA FALLS

The power and the glory

One of the most appealing things about a visit to Niagara Falls is realizing you are part of a diverse range of people walking around in awe of this mesmerizing natural phenomenon. There's an upbeat spirit and a feeling of comradery as everyone takes in the singularity of the Falls, their power and energy.

The town itself, with picturesque old trees and vintage homes, is worth a look as well. Go for a stroll along the river and you'll arrive at Queen St., lined with shops and restaurants.

For even more excitement, check out Fallsview Casino and Clifton Hill District. Not just a place to play games, Fallsview is also home to several restaurants, a theatre, and live concerts. Kids will love Clifton Hill, also known as the "Street of Fun," with many exciting attractions, such as a Ferris wheel, midway, mini golf, and more!

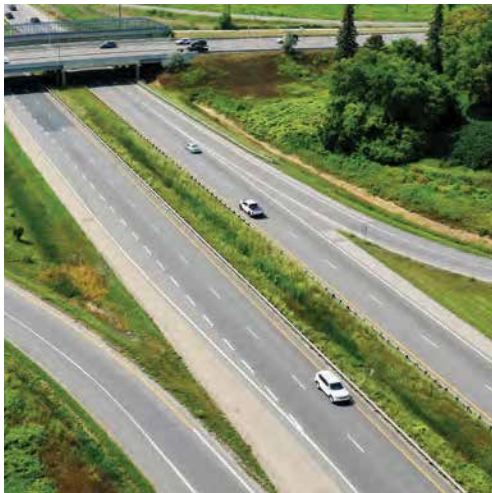

Guiding the future direction of Welland is its Strategic Plan, which outlines the goals of economic growth, health & well-being, environmental stewardship, and livability.

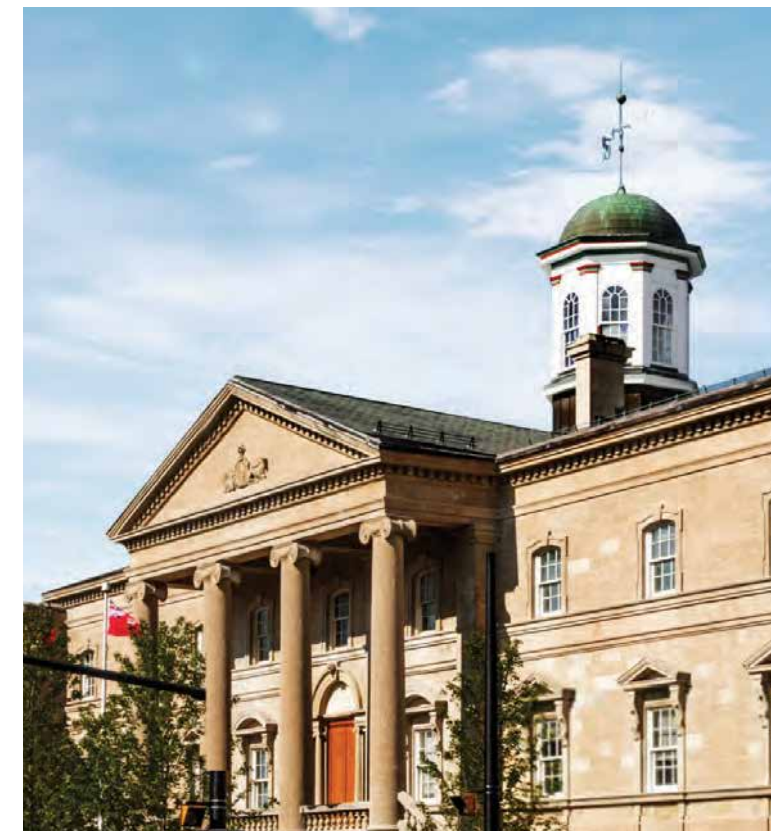
This strategic plan aims to create a diverse economy with quality employment, while also expanding health care services and recreation facilities.

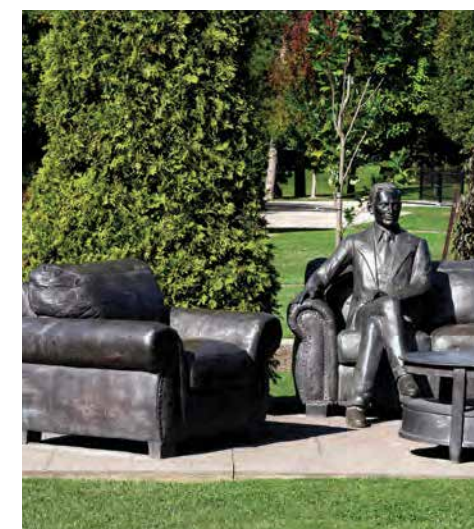

AN ENGINEERING MARVEL

The Welland Canal: Connecting the Great Lakes

Creation of the Canal

The Welland Canal is an important shipping lane, allowing large ships to travel between Lakes Erie and Ontario, bypassing the dangerous rapids and falls of the Niagara River. Way back in 1824, work started on the Canal, and since then, four slightly different routes have been constructed. Some of the

older routes now serve as recreational waterways for boating and swimming, and the present canal route runs north/south on the east side of the city. With the Welland River also bisecting Welland, water and waterside parks play a big role in the city, presenting easy escapes to nature close to home.

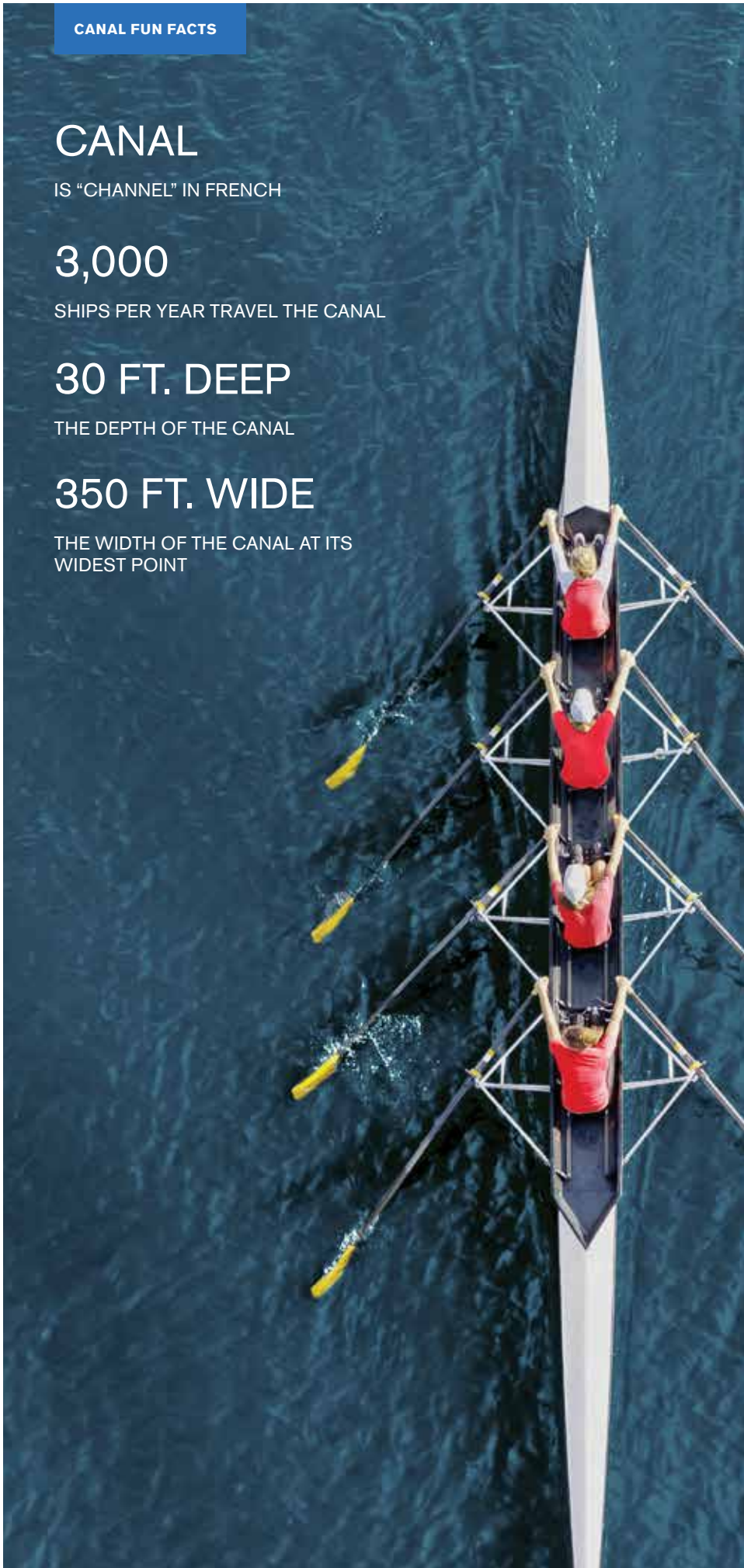

HISTORY

The big dig

The Welland Canal has gone through four redos, with four slightly different routes winding their way between Lake Ontario and Lake Erie.

1829

AFTER 5 YEARS OF CONSTRUCTION, THE FIRST WELLAND CANAL OPENED. THE SCHOONER ANNE & JANE WAS THE FIRST VESSEL TO TRAVEL THROUGH THE CANAL.

1882

THE CANAL REOPENED AFTER BEING DEEPEMED AND WIDENED IN ORDER TO ACCOMMODATE WIDER SHIPS WITH HEAVIER LOADS.

1887

THE CANAL WAS RECONFIGURED WITH A NEW SHORTER ALIGNMENT COMPLETED BETWEEN ST. CATHARINES AND PORT DALHOUSIE.

Today’s canal was built between the periods of 1913–1932, with an interruption during World War I, when there weren’t enough men to work on it. This was a completely different route, with only 8 locks, making transit faster through the canal.

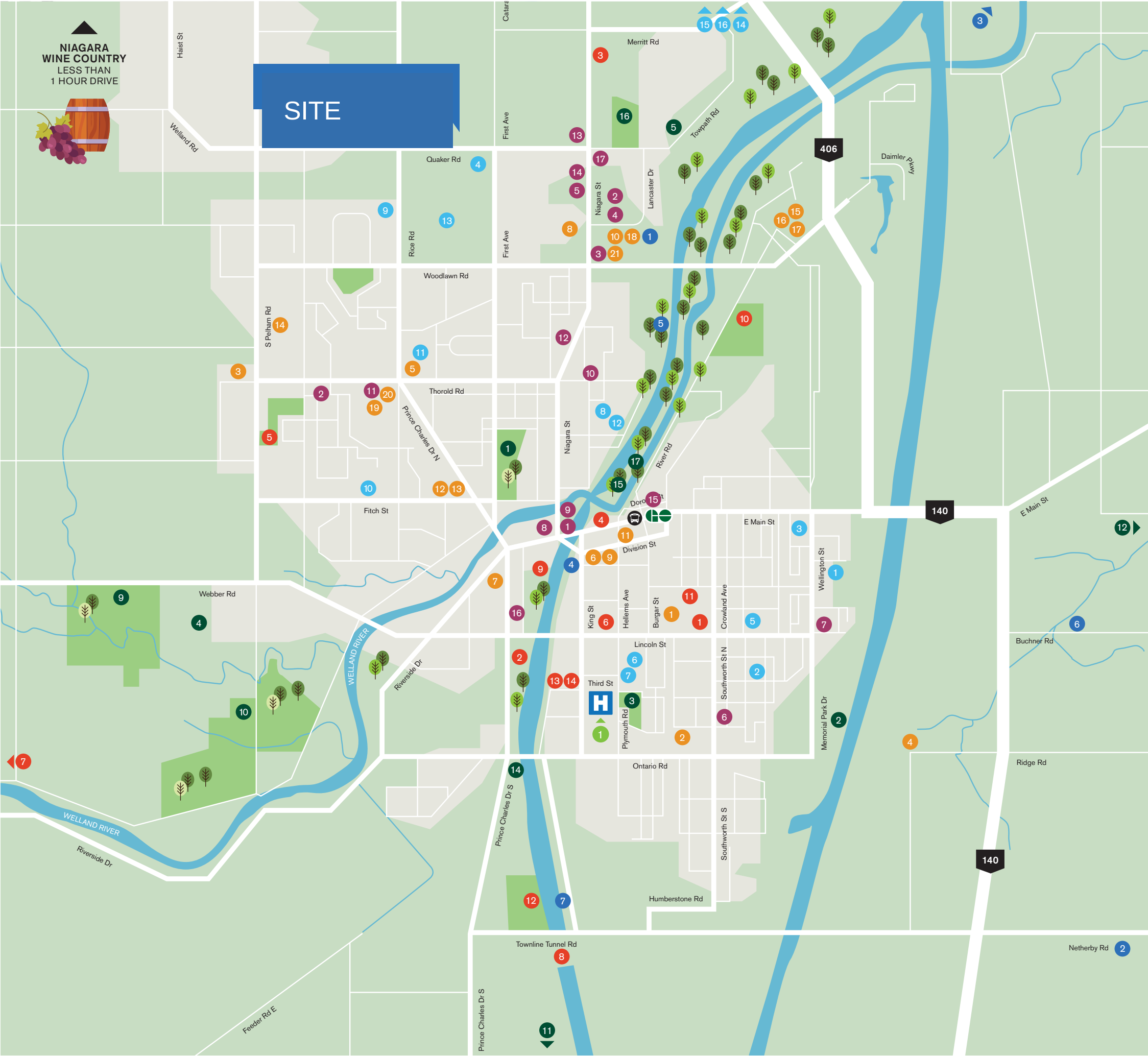

RECONNECT WITH NATURE

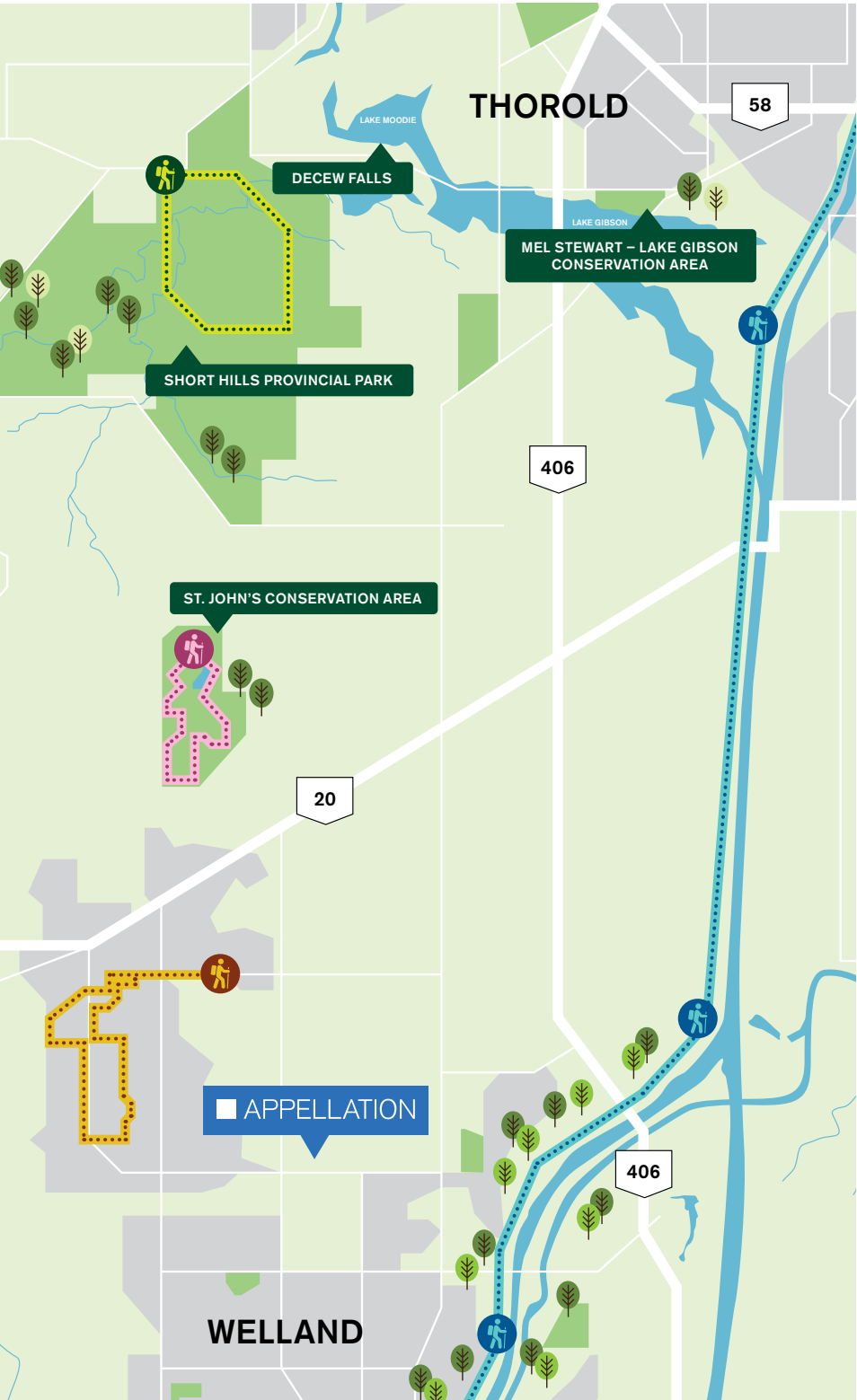
Green oasis awaiting discovery

WELLAND CANAL PARKWAY TRAIL

This trail follows the length of the shipping canal all the way from St. Catharines to Port Colborne. Walk or bike alongside massive ships making their way along the canal.

MEL SWART – LAKE GIBSON CONSERVATION PARK

This 29-acre, waterfront park on the shores of Lake Gibson opened in 2002, showcasing re-naturalization that has resulted in the return of numerous indigenous bird and animal species. Trails and a boardwalk over the water enable hikers to observe all this vibrant life.

DECEW FALLS

Hike into this scenic 72-foot waterfall that plunges into a turquoise stream below. It's right at the historic Morningstar Mill, so the whole scene is like a slice of life from the past.

ST. JOHN'S CONSERVATION AREA

Four trails of various lengths and difficulty wind their way through the large forest here. And if you're into fishing, this area might satisfy your need to hook the big one; it's a good spot for seasonal trout fishing.
